Pastor Brandon's Testimony

In God's kindness, I heard His saving Gospel from my mother and father from a very young age. I often say, this means God knew my stubborn heart needed to hear His good news of Jesus Christ crucified for sin and risen for our justification not a few dozen times but a few thousand times! God is good! By God's grace. all of my grandparents were born again and repented of their sins and trusted in Christ and urged their children to do the same. As a very small boy I remember sitting at my grandpa's feet in the morning as he read his Bible and prayed. When I was five years old, my mother shared the gospel with me (again!). I prayed to receive Christ, repenting of my sin and trusting in what God did in Christ

alone to forgive me and give eternal life and peace with God (John 3:16; Romans 5:1). Next to salvation, I consider being born into a united and believing home with faithful disciple-parents in both my mom and dad (and many relatives), one of the greatest blessings from the Lord. They brought me up in the faith and disciplined me for my good (though growing up I did not always view it as for my good!). I was baptized as a teenager and encouraged by many faithful brothers and sisters in Christ at our home church in Wheeling, IL. Growing up was difficult in more than one way for me—it was one of constant repentance and the Lord humbling me. I still remember reading Romans 1:30 "...they are "disobedient to their parents" listed next to murderers, and inventors of evil and confessing greatly to the Lord for my heinous, wrath-deserving sins. Later through the leading of mentors, friends, family and prayers, the Lord led me to vocational pastoral ministry a little over nine years ago. He affirmed my call to joyfully serve, preach, pastor, lead and lovingly come alongside God's people for God's glory. The Lord was and is totally faithful! Praise be to God for his grace in Christ! Surely with the Apostle Paul I 100% affirm about anything good you see in me, "By the grace of God, I am what I am..." (1 Cor. 15:10)

"Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. ²⁴ Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full. —The Lord Jesus in John 16:23-24

Hope from God's Word:

"In this world you will have tribulation. But take heart, I have overcome the world."

These are difficult days for many people. The church of the risen Lord Jesus faces a host of new challenges and tribulations. But we are not the first disciples to experience sorrow, confusion and tribulation (and should the Lord tarry we won't be the last!)

In John 16, the first disciples of Jesus had not yet witnessed the sufferings and death of their Lord on the cross. But soon they would. In fact, Jesus promised in his death that his disciples would face intense sorrow even as the world rejoiced (John 16:20).

Imagine, how would you react to these words from Jesus—"Friend, soon you will experience great grief even as others in this sinful world rejoice?" "How would you respond?"

Praise God His Word does not stop there! Jesus addressed these soon to be sorrow-filled disciples by telling them they would not remain sorrowful very long. Jesus who guaranteed their sorrow also guaranteed their sorrow would turn to joy.

And not just any joy, Jesus declared, but the deepest joy there is—a joy that no human being can steal (John 16:22) and an untouchable joy rooted in His coming resurrection. As the early disciples had the promise of an untouchable, resurrection-shaped joy that would swallow up and replace their anguish, so

do we who are in Christ friends (John 16:21)!

In his resurrection Jesus displayed he is more powerful than our greatest fears. Our God alone is the strong conquering King. In His death and resurrection, Jesus demonstrated He has total power over the grave, over fears, over enslavement to sin and over the devil (who in some sense had the power of death but no longer, see Hebrews 2:14). The crucifixion and resurrection brought in a new day. A day ushered in by the fulfillment of promises God made by the prophets. Prophets like Isaiah who 700 years before the start of Jesus incarnate ministry on earth stated:

You shall see, and your heart shall rejoice; your bones shall flourish like the grass; and the hand of the LORD shall be known to his servants, and he shall show his indignation against his enemies. Isaiah 66:14

Jesus knew even with all these words of assurance from his mouth, his most loyal disciples would soon abandon him as he went to the cross. But Jesus also knew his Father would back him and not leave him alone (John 16:31-32). In declaring his disciples would leave him and be scattered (vs. 32), Jesus drives every Christian to the one who never fails and who we owe our ultimate allegiance to: God almighty.

"It is part of the character and genius of the Church that its foundation members were discredited men; it owed its existence not to their faith, courage, or virtue, but to what Christ had done with them; and this they could never forget." - C.H. Dodd

Friends, our Lord promised his first disciples their sorrow would turn to joy and made good on that. Ours is a resurrection-shaped, untouched joy that produces hope even in times of fear. The Lord longs to have our hearts consumed by what He has done for us in the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The disciples were slow to get this as we often are. But no matter what we face or what tribulation or trouble we presently endure, remember our Lord's words have been revealed and given to us for our good. When we dwell on the words of our Lord, he grants us peace as we are reminded again that for those of us in Christ, the most important and eternal things have been settled forever.

I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." —the Lord Jesus in John 16:33
