WHAT WE ARE DOING? AND WHAT WE SHOULD DO?

## WELCOME

Welcome to Volume 2 of the FBCN Newsletter or the “current new normal” editions.

The text of Pastor Myers sermon this week will be from the book of Galatians, Chapter 3 verses 10-29.

For all who rely on works of the law are under a curse; for it is written, “Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law, and do them.”<sup>11</sup> Now it is evident that no one is justified before God by the law, for “The righteous shall live by faith.”<sup>12</sup> But the law is not of faith, rather “The one who does them shall live by them.”<sup>13</sup> Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree”—<sup>14</sup> so that in Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles, so that we might receive the promised Spirit through faith.<sup>15</sup> To give a human example, brothers: even with a man-made covenant, no one

annuls it or adds to it once it has been ratified.<sup>16</sup> Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring. It does not say, “And to offsprings,” referring to many, but referring to one, “And to your offspring,” who is Christ.<sup>17</sup> This is what I mean: the law, which came 430 years afterward, does not annul a covenant previously ratified by God, so as to make the promise void.<sup>18</sup> For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; but God gave it to Abraham by a promise.<sup>19</sup> Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, until the offspring should come to whom the promise had been made, and it was put in place through angels by an intermediary.<sup>20</sup> Now an intermediary implies more than one, but God is one.<sup>21</sup> Is the law then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the law.<sup>22</sup> But the scripture imprisoned everything under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be

given to those who believe.<sup>23</sup> Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed.<sup>24</sup> So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith.<sup>25</sup> But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian,<sup>26</sup> for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith.<sup>27</sup> For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ.<sup>28</sup> There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.<sup>29</sup> And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise.

Grace and peace from God our Father through Jesus Christ brothers and sisters in Christ and a Happy Thanksgiving to you and every friend of First Baptist Church of Niles!

As Claude described Harvest Supper I was so bummed we had to cancel it this year because it sounded like such a rich time of fellowship and feasting! Though I know 2020 has been very difficult on all of us (some more than others) as Christians we still have so much to be thankful for. We know the source of every good gift and every perfect gift: the Lord himself. Consider God's Word in James 1:17-18

*<sup>17</sup> Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. <sup>18</sup> Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures. <sup>1</sup>*

Every gift. Not some. Not most. Every single one is from God's hand. From the meal you enjoy, today, the encouragement you receive, the health you have, friendships, family, church, your job your skills all of it—from God's hand! And this God is unchangeably good and undivided in his intentions. God is eager to give when asked (James 1:5) and unlike we who often doubt and are double-minded, and are unstable in our ways (James 1:6-8) God has not only given us gifts but works in our

very lives to change us and mightily work through His Word in us.

Verse 18 of the book of James tells us, "Through the Word of truth—the gospel of Christ revealed in Scripture God has brought us forth!" Matthew Henry helpfully summarizes it this way: *"As every good gift is from God, so particularly the renovation of our natures, our regeneration, and all the holy happy consequences of it, must be ascribed to him"*<sup>2</sup>

What are you most thankful for in 2020? Pause and take time to really thank God friends!
